#### Arrival

Camporee 2014 is taking place at Fitzroy Provincial Park. For details regarding the Park and directions on how to get there, we suggest that you visit their website - <a href="http://www.ontarioparks.com/english/fitz.html">http://www.ontarioparks.com/english/fitz.html</a>. Please plan to arrive at the campground between 4:00 and 8:00 P.M. Camping area maps with assigned sites will be distributed at the pre-camp meeting on Thursday May 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### Vehicle Control

While tent trailers are discouraged, they are only allowed with the permission of the Camp Committee. To obtain permission, contact the camp chief at paul@barbeau.net

<u>One</u> on-site parking pass will be allotted to each registered section. Additional on-site parking passes are discouraged, but available at a fee of \$25.00 each. Off-site parking passes for the main parking lot will be provided to each registrant. Arrangements are being made for a small bus that will be used to transport people to and from the main parking lot to the camping area(s). The bus will not be available on Sunday. Further details regarding this will be provided at the pre-camp meeting.

All participants will be directed to their appropriate camping area upon arrival. After unloading, vehicles with off-site parking passes must **immediately** proceed to the main



parking lot. Failure to do so could result in a \$25.00 fine to the Section's Group Committee. All off-site vehicles must be off-site by 8:30 P.M. Only vehicles with on-site parking passes will be permitted to remain parked in the camp area. Everyone entering the camp, whether for the weekend or to drop off campers, <u>must have an off-site parking pass displayed in the window of their vehicle or they may be refused entry to the Park.</u>

On-site and off-site parking passes will be distributed at the pre-camp meeting. Please ensure that holders of parking passes complete the required information on the pass. This is necessary so that the owner of the vehicle can be located in the event of an emergency.

On Sunday, participants will be able to pick up their vehicle from the main parking lot <u>after the Closing Ceremonies</u>. For safety reasons it is imperative that this rule is abided by. There will be too much pedestrian traffic on the roads until that time.

To help alleviate some of the traffic congestion, some groups are considering renting a bus. Here are some of the local bus companies to contact if your group is interested in going this route:

#### Registration Forms

Program Participant Enrolment Form, Application for Membership and Appointment for Volunteers, Physical Fitness Form for Non Members for all persons attending Camporee (youth, leaders, parents, etc.) One copy is required in a sealed envelope clearly labeled with your section name. These forms will not be viewed except by the appropriate people (first aid/emergency staff) and only in the event of an emergency. These forms need not be originals. Photocopies are acceptable. They can be picked up at the end of the camp. Forms not picked up will be destroyed.
- 3. Section Participant Summary Form

All other forms attached to this registration package are being provided for your ease of use.

There will be a meeting for all Section Contact Leaders Friday May 23 evening at 9:00 P.M. at Camporee Headquarters to confirm final attendance and any last minute details.



### Alcohol, Drugs and Smoking

As with any Scouting event, alcohol and illegal drugs are NOT PERMITTED at any time during the weekend. Anyone caught with alcohol/drugs will be asked to leave the Camporee. **NO EXCEPTIONS!!!!** Scouting policy doesn't allow you to smoke in front of the youth. If you are a cigarette smoker, please find a location away from the youth and ensure that you use a butt can. It would be appreciated if these rules could be relayed to parents attending Camporee.

#### Campfire Pits

We have been advised by Fitzroy Provincial Park that only existing and designated campfire pits be used and that the creation of new fire pits and/or the use of 'portable' fire pits are strictly prohibited.

#### T-shirt Orders

We strongly recommend that t-shirts be ordered at least one size larger than what would normally be ordered for the wearer. Youth medium will fit a small Beaver. Please relay this information to parents of participating youth. Camp T-shirts are the uniform of the day for all participants on Saturday and Sunday. XXL, XXXL and larger sizes are available for an additional fee of \$3.00. Extra Camporee t-shirts are also available at a cost of \$5.00. It is suggested that you have your members also wear their neckers. They will provide group identification and will also protect their necks from the sun. We strongly recommend that everyone wear hats and carry full water bottles with them at all times.

#### Field Activity Equipment

If your section brings supplies or equipment into the park for games and activities during the weekend, it is the group's responsibility to take home or dispose of all materials as per Fitzroy Harbor Provincial Park regulations. Further details regarding this will be provided at the pre-camp meeting. "Leave no trace".

Swimming will not be allowed for the duration of the Camporee.

No pets are allowed at Camp.
